CHAPTER 45:54

DECEASED WIFE'S SISTER'S MARRIAGE ACT

An Act relating to marriage with a deceased wife's sister.

Ch. 29. No. 3. 23 of 1911.

[24TH JULY 1911]

Commencement.

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Deceased Wife's Sister's Short title. Marriage Act.
- 2. In this Act, the expression "sister" includes a sister of Interpretation. the half-blood.
- **3.** (1) Every marriage, otherwise lawful, contracted before otherwise lawful or after the commencement of this Act, between a man and his between any deceased wife's sister, within or outside Trinidad and Tobago, is man and his deceased wife's deemed to be and to have been valid and of full force and effect, sister, valid.

- (2) Where before the commencement of this Act any such marriage had been annulled by a Court of competent jurisdiction or either party (after the marriage and during the life of the other) had lawfully married another, such marriage is deemed to have become and to be void upon and after the day upon which it was so annulled or upon which either party to the marriage lawfully married another as mentioned above.
- **4.** (1) No right, title, estate or interest, whether in possession Saving of or expectancy, and whether vested or contingent, at the and interests. commmencement of this Act existing in, to, or in respect of any property, and no act or thing lawfully done or omitted before the commencement of this Act, shall be prejudicially affected, nor shall any will be deemed to have been revoked by reason of any marriage previously contracted and made valid by this Act.

(2) Nothing in this Act shall affect the devolution or Insane person distribution of the real or personal estate of any intestate, not being a party to the marriage, who at the commencement of this Act was, and until his death continued to be, a mentally ill person within the meaning of the Mental Health Act.
